**EXPLORATION** (ages 6-9)

Younger campers spend exhilarating days experiencing everything from world rhythms and dance to choral singing and mixed-media art projects, from instrument making to theater and storytelling.

Full-day Exploration sessions are taught by enthusiastic professional artists who understand how best to help children spark their own creativity.

Each session features a fresh and exciting mix of performing and visual arts experiences that vary thematically from session to session. Structured activities are balanced with free time for play outdoors. Sessions conclude with a showcase for family and friends.

### **BROADWAY BOUND** (ages 9-14)

Broadway Bound challenges young people with a strong interest in theater to train as a “triple threat” singer, dancer and actor.

- **Session One’s** music celebrates Broadway classics from the Golden Age (1930-1965).
- **Session Two** emphasizes contemporary favorites (1966-today).
- In **Session Three** students will have a hand in creating the original musical revue *Building Broadway: From Showboat to Hamilton, How Musicals Are Made* in preparation for its world premiere

in February 2019 as part of SFArtsED’s 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary season.

Each Broadway Bound session culminates with showcase performances on the last day for family and friends. Enrollment in a Broadway Bound session is a prerequisite for consideration for being invited to join the SFArtsED Players musical theater company.

### **FASHION** (ages 10-14)

Designers now have three sessions to explore their fashion-forward creativity.

- **Session One:** Fashion Basics: Students will learn garment construction basics such as cutting a standard pattern, closure methods, and fabric manipulation techniques such as quilting, pleating, and trapunto along with textile vocabulary that will culminate with the making of an accessory and/or basic garment. Students will also try out experimental pattern-making techniques, be introduced to surface design and learn about using recycled materials in garment design. This class is suitable for a beginner but will also offer advanced techniques for the intermediate sewer.

- **Session Two:** Knitting Jamboree introduces designers to the wonders of knitting and all the stylish, surprising things needles and yarn can create. Students will practice hand-knitting techniques and learn to use knitting machines.

- **Session Three:** Diversity on the Fashion Runway asks the question: what are subcultures? How are they defined by music, hobbies, history, class, cultural or political beliefs? How do people use fashion to communicate who they are to the world? These questions will be our point of departure as we spend two weeks investigating the ways humans seek to communicate what is special about them, and to what group(s) they identify with. Students will then create a garment that represents the key aspects of a chosen genre and will be challenged to juxtapose this genre with a historical era of their choosing – think punk in the 1950s or preppy with a Victorian silhouette. Students will use garment construction, basic textile concepts and fabric manipulation techniques to create their own textiles via dyeing and surface design. Each student’s piece will be built with the intention of being both shown in a gallery setting as well as performed in. Students will have the opportunity to fit performers in their garment or perform in it themselves. Final designs will be translated into choreography performed in a site-specific performance at Minnesota Street Project in August 2018.

### **ART & DESIGN** (ages 10-14)

Art & Design explores various aspects of and develops skills in visual art making.

- **Session One** Art & Design: Sculpture explores the worlds of clay and three-dimensional creations.

- In **Session Two**, Art & Design artists focus on the fine arts and building block skills of painting, drawing and illustration.

- In **Session Three**, Art & Design takes young visual artists into the Artists’ Studio, an exploration of mixed-media arts that includes collage, paints, stencils and more in Art & Design: Artists’ Studio (Mixed Media)

A curated exhibition in SFArtsED’s Minnesota Street Project gallery space in August will feature work created in all Art & Design sessions. The exhibition runs through September.
